Week 1 Creation - Genesis 2:4-25



Read 2:4-25 - Think, pair, share What does this passage teach us about God and ourselves?

Group time - Wrestle further

Who?

Who are the main characters (even the animals) and what do we learn about them? (keep in mind chapter 1)

What? What is the order of creation (who rules over who? See also 1:26-31)?

What does this mean for the relationship between God and man? And man and animals?

There are only 2 chapters given to us that describe life before sin entered the world.

Why are they important? (Would we lose anything if we didn't have these chapters?)




Who are the main characters and what do we learn about them?

- They disobeyed God's command (vs 3)
- They ate fruit that made them spiritually dead (vs 5)
- They wanted to be like God (vs 5)
- They were walking around naked (vs 7)
- They didn't confess, but blamed others (vs 12-13)
- They reversed the order of creation (established in 1:28)
- Other

What does this tell us about the complexities of sin?



The Last Days - Prayer


Prayer: (Break into groups of 3 to discuss and pray) How has God been at work in your life this week?
